### **Professional Development:**

- New Teacher Induction
  - All new staff to PCA will receive Dyknow training, Google Classroom/Website training, and PowerSchool training. Joseph Hurdt, Steve Putnam, and Audrey Deaton will assist with these training sessions.
  - New staff members who teach math and reading in grades K-8 will receive i-Ready and Ready Math training. Pinnacle is very thankful for the work the Sheriff's department put into this event to help better educate and train officers and school personnel.

#### Scholarship Committee

- The scholarship committee will begin meeting soon to develop a calendar of activities and fundraisers for the 2023-2024 school year. Pinnacle students were awarded \$23,300 from local scholarships last year and \$7,212,712.00 from various universities and colleges.
- The goal for the Class of 2024 will be to earn over \$4,000,000.00 in scholarships with at least \$35,000 being from local sponsors.

#### Academics

 Daissy Soto, a rising senior, has been accepted to Project Uplift at Chapel Hill. Project Uplift is a summer enrichment and college access program designed to promote and increase access to higher education for rising high school seniors, especially those underrepresented in postsecondary education. While there, participants learn about the college admissions process, interact with faculty, staff, and current students, and participate in educational, cultural, and social activities. Project Uplift scholars have the opportunity to immerse themselves in college life and experience the academic rigor and social climate of a four-year institution.

 Daissy Soto is also attending Gardner-Webb Univeristy's Science Academy. The camp provides numerous hands-on activities in a university laboratory from a variety of scientific disciplines (molecular biology, human physiology, exercise science and forensic science), visits to numerous local science-related businesses (Rutherford Regional Medical Center, Cohesion Phenomics DNA lab and the Rutherford County Sheriff's Forensics Division) as well as interactions with various university departments (physician assistant, exercise science, university police, and

admissions).

 Recently, Hannah Clontz and Will Brooks, rising juniors, were recognized at the Classical Liberals of the Carolinas' Conference in Asheville, NC as CLC Junior Scholars. Students were selected based on their performance in either the Economics and Personal Finance class and the dual enrollment course from the University of Arizona Ethics, Economy, and Entrepreneurship.

#### • Athletics

- The PCA Archery team, the Thunderbirds did very well at Nationals this year. They placed 3rd place in the youth team (Middle School) at Nationals after winning the State Championship!
  - Makenzie Glenn, a ninth grader at Pinnacle Classical Academy, won the individual national championship title in the youth female pins division at the 11th annual Scholastic 3-D Archery (S3DA) 3D National Championship.
  - Heather Carswell, an eleventh grader, placed fourth in the nation in the young adult division.

# Honoring Academic Excellence A Report to the Board of Directors of Pinnacle Classical Academy Jeff Ziegler August 4, 2023

At a meeting on July 25, Dr. Shope, Mrs. Brooks, Mrs. Richardson, and Mr. Ziegler discussed ways to honor truly exceptional academic performance at the school. We agreed to the following:

1. CLC Junior Scholars: In a recurring award beginning in August 2023, Classical Liberals in the Carolinas (CLC) will be honoring two students as CLC Junior Scholars. These students will be honored on a plaque at the entrance of the school.

- 2. Full scholarships: When students receive full scholarships to college (i.e., full tuition, room, and board), these students will be memorialized on the upstairs hallway with a picture of the college, picture of the student, college name, and college and PCA logos/seals.
- 3. NCSSM/NCSA: When students leave PCA for the North Carolina School of the Arts or the North Carolina School of Science and Mathematics, and then graduate from NCSA or NCSSM, these students will be invited to the PCA graduation and honored with a brick.
- 4. Distinguished Academic Achievement Plaque: A special distinguished academic achievement plaque will honor students who are recognized for distinguished performance nationwide in an essay contest or for similar extraordinary academic achievement.
- 5. These achievements will be honored with a press release and a certificate presented to students at a board meeting. At the September board meeting, we would like to honor Bonnie Westbrook for being a semifinalist in a national essay contest and to honor Will Brooks and Hannah Clontz for being CLC Junior Scholars.

Hadley graduated with distinction from the University of North Carolina as a Morehead-Cain Scholar with a double major in economics and journalism. She now lives in Denver, Colorado, with her husband and children.
